



Learning about being an artist is neverending! What Makes a Subject Paintable by Gabor Svagrik & Phil Starke

Consider these 7 aspects first when analyzing a scene:

- 1. Lighting. Does the subject have good lighting, contrast.
- 2. Shape. does it have a variety of shapes and sizes. Big shapes are better than small shapes.
- 3. Mood or atmosphere. Look for depth and atmospheric changes that can create a mood.
- 4. Angles. Consider all different angles of your subject before you photograph or
- 5. Composition. Look for a good, simple composition. A good composition will carry a painting.
- 6. Simplicity. Detail doesn't make your painting better. Spend more time deciding what to leave out instead of trying to put in everything you see.
- 7. Emotional Attachment. I don't always have an attachment to my subject, especially if I'm painting in new areas but it does help when I have a deeper interest in my subject.

Try to decide what it is that draws you to a scene or a still life set up.I will find out if a subject is paintable through thumbnail drawings or color sketches.a subject can look paintable but when I start to put it on canvas I find out its not usually because of poor composition or too much detail. Stay with the initial idea that drew you to a scene, don't get sidetracked with unnecessary detail. Walk around a scene to find the best angle, get a feel for the subject first (even with photography!).



Salvador Dali, one of the most famous artists of all t ime, used to avoid paying at restaurants by drawing on the back of the checks he would leave. These drawings made the checks too valuable to actually cash, and the restaurant would be left with a very valuable drawing but no actual cash. This saved Dali tons of money throughout his travels, and many of the restaurants sold the drawings for much more than Dali actually owed them.
