




Bev Boren

fun facts About Turkeys:

1. Native to North America: Turkeys are indigenous to the Americas and were domesticated by indigenous peoples long before European settlers arrived.
2. Two Species: There are two main species of turkey: the wild turkey (*Meleagris gallopavo*) and the ocellated turkey (*Meleagris ocellata*).
3. Unique Vocalizations: Turkeys can produce a variety of sounds, including gobbles, clucks, and purrs. Male turkeys are known for their distinctive gobbling.
4. Impressive Vision: Turkeys have excellent eyesight and can see in color. They can also see in the ultraviolet spectrum, which helps them spot predators.
5. Social Birds: Wild turkeys are social animals and often live in flocks. They communicate with each other using various calls and body language.
6. Flight Capabilities: Despite their size, wild turkeys can fly short distances at speeds up to 55 miles per hour (88.5 km/h) and can fly as high as 200 feet (61 meters).
7. Mating Rituals: During mating season, male turkeys display their feathers, puff out their chests, and strut to attract females.
8. Long Lifespan: In the wild, turkeys can live up to 3-5 years, while domesticated turkeys often have shorter lifespans due to breeding practices.
9. Cultural Significance: Turkeys are an important symbol in American culture, especially during Thanksgiving, where they are often the centerpiece of the meal.
10. Unique Feet: Turkeys have a special adaptation in their feet that allows them to perch in trees, which helps them escape from predators.
